

SIMONS PASS STATION LIMITED applied for the following resource consents:

CRC062869: (a) Discharge surplus irrigation water to Pukaki River at a maximum rate not exceeding 1,531 litres per second, at or about map references NZMS 260 H38:874-563 and H38:880-540;

(b) Discharge surplus irrigation water to non-irrigated land in unspecified locations, at a rate of between 25 litres per second and 250 litres per second.

	Limitation on Works	
1	(a) Water shall only be discharged to the Pukaki River at or about map reference H38:880-540, as shown on Plan CRC062869; (b) The discharge shall only be water from the Pukaki Irrigation Company scheme irrigation race; (c) Water shall only be discharged at a rate not exceeding 1531 litres per second.	
2	(a) All practicable measures shall be undertaken to avoid erosion of the bed or banks of the Pukaki River occurring as a result of the discharge. (b) In the event of any erosion occurring to the bed or banks of the Pukaki River, as a result of the discharge, the consent holder shall be responsible for rectifying the situation as soon as practicable.	
3	The discharge, after reasonable mixing, shall not cause a change in the colour or a reduction of the clarity of the receiving water body.	
4	The consent holder shall before the first exercise of this consent: (a) install a water meter(s) that has an international accreditation or equivalent New Zealand calibration endorsement, which will measure the rate and the volume of water discharged to within an accuracy of plus or minus ten percent, at a location that will ensure the total discharge of water is measured; (b) Take a reading from the water meter at least quarterly and record the date and the meter reading either electronically or in a log book kept for that purpose; and supply this data to the Canterbury Regional Council, Attention: RMA Compliance and Enforcement Manager, when requested in writing. (c) Ensure that the water meter is accessible to the Canterbury Regional Council at all times for inspection. (d) Ensure that the water meter is installed, operated and maintained throughout the duration of the consent in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. (e) Take all practicable measures to ensure that the water meter is fully functional at all times.	
	Review of Conditions	
5	The Canterbury Regional Council may, once per year, on any of the last five working days of May or November, serve notice of its intention to review the conditions of this consent for the purposes of dealing with any adverse effect on the environment which may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage.	
	Lapsing of Consent	
6	The lapsing date for the purposes of section 125 shall be 5 years from the date of the grant of this consent.	

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
