

Environment Canterbury Resource Management Postgraduate Scholarship Scholarship Guidelines

Where there are sufficient suitable applications, Environment Canterbury will provide an Environment Canterbury Resource Management Postgraduate Scholarship up to a value of up to \$10,000 for the duration of one year to postgraduate/masters students.

For scholarship recipients paid holiday employment at Environment Canterbury may be offered. Such employment would be based in Christchurch and would run from November to February of the year that the scholarship is awarded.

All scholarship applicants should read these guidelines in their entirety before applying for the scholarship. By signing and submitting these guidelines along with their scholarship application, applicants are confirming that they have read and understood the guideline.

1. Purpose of the Scholarship:

Environment Canterbury provides the scholarship to encourage students to specialise their postgraduate study in the field of resource management/science. Scholarships are also aimed at extending specialised study at honours level or higher.

2. Tertiary Provider:

Scholarships are available to students studying full-time at Canterbury Otago or Lincoln Universities.

3. Criteria:

Students applying for scholarships must have met the following criteria:

- Enrolled full time at Canterbury, Otago or Lincoln University.
- Have successfully completed study at Bachelors level and be planning a related honours project or postgraduate study (including Masters Degree).

4. Application

Scholarship applicants are required to submit an application containing:

- Scholarship application form
- Verified academic transcripts of study completed to date.
- A CV outlining relevant work experience, qualifications and interests.
- A proposal for the project/thesis topic that the applicant will be pursuing in the year of study.

- A minimum of two referees who can be contacted by Environment Canterbury to provide information on the students' likelihood of academic and work-based success in this area.
- A copy of a relevant project undertaken during the student's course of study to date.
- Signed scholarship guidelines.

5. *Selection of Scholarship Recipients:*

Scholarship recipients will be selected by a panel of Environment Canterbury representatives including but not limited to staff from appropriate sections within Environment Canterbury. Environment Canterbury may also invite other parties to participate in the selection panel including representative from Canterbury, Otago and Lincoln Universities and relevant external organisations.

Scholarship applicants that are short-listed will at minimum be interviewed by the selection panel, and required to give a presentation on an environmental topic specified by the panel.

Criteria to be considered will include:

- The academic merit of the candidate
- The likely benefit of the proposed project/thesis to the Environment Canterbury resource management or natural resources planning.
- The commitment of the candidate to working in the area of sustainable management of the environment.

6. *Timing:*

Applicants for 2012 scholarships will open on 15 August 2011 and close on 3 October 2011. Notification to successful applicant will be made as soon as possible after the close date.

7. *Payment of Scholarship:*

Scholarship payment will be made to recipients in four equal instalments by direct debit to students nominated bank account by 31 March, 31 May, 31 July and 30 September respectively in the year of receipt of the scholarship. Payments in July and September will be made on the proviso that the student has provided Environment Canterbury with

evidence of successful completion of the first semester. Scholarship recipients taking a two-year Masterate may by negotiation be able to split scholarship payments over a two-year period.

8. Value and Tenure of Scholarship:

The value of the scholarship is a maximum of \$10,000. The scholarship is available for one year only apart from Masters students who negotiate longer scholarship tenure.

9. Scholarship Regulations:

- (i) The scholarship shall be known as the Environment Canterbury Resource Management Postgraduate Scholarship.
- (ii) Scholarship is available to honours, and postgraduate students meeting the criteria listed above.
- (iii) The Scholarship will be administered by Environment Canterbury in consultation with Canterbury, Otago or Lincoln Universities.
- (iv) There will be one recipient of the scholarship each year. Where there are not enough suitable applicants, Environment Canterbury reserves the right to not award any scholarship.
- (v) Environment Canterbury reserves the right to change the value of the scholarship awarded, prior to awarding the scholarship. The value of the scholarship will not be changed once it is awarded.
- (vi) Scholarship applicants are expected to be pursuing a postgraduate course in areas of Resource Management and express an interest in developing a career in these areas.
- (vii) Scholarship recipients are expected to demonstrate a high level of academic achievement in study to date.
- (viii) Any employment at Environment Canterbury (temporary or permanent) is conditional on scholarship recipients meeting other Environment Canterbury employment criteria included in the application form declaration.
- (ix) Scholarship recipients completing an honours course under scholarship would be required to complete a research project related to environmental issues as agreed with Environment Canterbury.
- (x) Recipients undertaking a Masters course would be expected to include appropriate resource management papers and related research (as agreed with Environment Canterbury) as part of their academic course.
- (xi) Scholarship recipients will agree to media and publicity responsibility as required.
- (xii) Scholarships will only be awarded to New Zealand citizens or New Zealand permanent residents studying full time at Canterbury or Lincoln Universities.

- (xiii) Only students studying full time in the year the scholarship is awarded are eligible.
- (xiv) The scholarship is available for one years study only. Candidates may reapply for a scholarship in subsequent years, however successful award is not guaranteed.
- (xv) Scholarship recipients, who withdraw from full time study, or, fail to successfully complete required papers, may be required to reimburse all or part of the scholarships value to Environment Canterbury. This clause is subject to appeal to Environment Canterbury.
- (xvi) Applicants are required to sign and submit these guidelines with their scholarship application. Scholarship applications that do not contain all the requirements listed in clause four of these guidelines will not be accepted.
- (xvii) Environment Canterbury reserves the right to make changes to these guidelines.
- (xviii) These guidelines were written and effective from the date of the signing off this proposal.

10. *Privacy of Personal Applicant information:*

Personal information on scholarship applicants is collected under the Privacy Act 1993, and remains property of Environment Canterbury. Such information will be used to assess the candidates' suitability for scholarship, and for purposes listed above in the scholarship guidelines.

Information on successful and unsuccessful applicants will be held and stored in a confidential, secure manner, in line with the requirements of the Privacy Act 1993.

Personal information of scholarship recipients may be disclosed to external parties for the purposes of media statements, environment Canterbury publicity and scholarship promotion.

Under the Privacy Act 1993, candidates are entitled to request access, copy and/or request changes to personal information.
