1. We have been advised of a potential conflict of interest by Commissioner Dr Jane Kitson. Dr Kitson's statement is attached.

OUR POSITION

- 2. It is the Chairman's view that the pending employment of Dr Kitson by Ngāi Tahu is such that it is not necessary for her to recuse herself for the following reasons:
 - we have completed our findings on the provisions in Plan Change 6 Wairewa;
 - at the end of the hearing all but one minor matter had been agreed between Ngāi Tahu and the Council;
 - no other party had issue with the agreement reached between Ngāi Tahu and the Council.
- 3. Further, in the circumstances of this case, any possible conflict would not be such that Dr Kitson could not continue in an unbiased manner.

- 4. However, in the interests of fairness, we wish to give any party who considers themselves affected to make an appropriate application.

Tēnā koe Gordon,

I am writing to you to inform you of a potential conflict that will soon arise, through my upcoming employment by Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu (TRONT). On the 18th July 2016, I commence a new position as the Senior Environmental Advisor Mahinga Kai/ Freshwater Monitoring, based in Invercargill.

As the last set of deliberations will occur during the start of my employment I thought it prudent to notify you of my changing circumstance, and to signal the need to assess if this would be perceived as a conflict of interest in what remains of the deliberations process.
