Note: The above approach assumes that your farming practices, as modelled for your Nitrogen Baseline, are consistent with the good management practices as considered in the Plan Change 2 Hearing process (A report prepared by MRB was originally used to define GMP in the Hinds/Hekaeo area however, other work including economic modelling was introduced by the primary sector and accepted by the Hearing Panel). If the farming practices in your Nitrogen Baseline are inconsistent with these practices, then your Nitrogen Baseline file(s) will need to be adjusted either prior or during the consent process to reflect good management practice. Most farms in the Hinds/Hekaeo area are likely to have been operating consistent with this level of good management practice, talk to the person who modelled your Nitrogen Baseline to establish whether your files need adjusting. - Applying the same amount of irrigation water during the shoulder seasons, that you apply at the peak of summer;
- Applying nitrogen fertiliser during May, June or July;
- Applying nitrogen fertiliser in excess of 400 kg/ha/yr.

It is important to note that this approach is different to the Nitrogen Baseline GMP numbers that are calculated using the Portal.
