



#### SAVING THE GODWITS by Keith Woodley




Keith is the Manager of Pukorokoro Miranda Shorebird Centre, in the Firth of Thames

Following the 2010/2011 earthquakes, a significant amount of vertical deformation within and around the Avon-Heathcote Estuary/Ihutai changed tidal inundation levels within the saltmarshes. 
