Purpose:

Multi Code Long Distance Race: Avon River

#### Reservation:

- 1. No vessels or persons except those competing in the Multi Code Long Distance race organized by Canterbury Rowing Association and any powered vessels that are safety boats.
- 2. Powered vessels acting as safety boats are permitted to exceed the 5 knot river speed limit as prescribed by the Navigation safety Bylaw 2016 8 (2) provided they are only keeping pace with the tail end race craft or in the case of an emergency.
- 3. Race craft are exempt from complying with the Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016, Attachment A: B(1)

#### Conditions:

#### Publication of notice of Reservation:

All relevant boating clubs that use the Avon River in the reserved area, whitebaiters and other river users are to be advised through:

Social Media, the public notices of the Christchurch Press and Star, e-mails to relevant clubs and handing notices to whitebaiters on the race course are at least one week prior to the race.

## Notice of Reservation to be:

Displayed at: Any boating access point on the river

Displayed by: Canterbury Rowing Association or its representative.

Removed by: Canterbury Rowing Association or its representative.

A copy of the Temporary Reservation Certificate to be carried by: To be held by the designated event manager

### Safety conditions:

- 1. Safety Boats are not permitted to travel faster than the speed of the racing craft.
- 2. Safety Boats are to keep wake to a minimum at all times unless in an emergency.
- 3. All safety boats are to carry sufficient approved lifejackets for the largest crewed vessel in the race, all crew on the safety boats are to wear life jackets at all times whilst underway.
- 4. Should an unauthorised vessel be on the course all vessels are to return to the normal navigation rules as prescribed by the Maritime Rule 91 and 22.
- 5. Safety staff are to be in visual contact at all times with all racing vessels and advise the race controller of any incidents immediately.
- 6. All craft entering the race are to comply with the Navigation Safety bylaw 2016 part 5 (1) wearing of life jackets, with exception of rowing skiffs belonging to Rowing New Zealand or Canterbury Rowing clubs who must adhere to the Rowing Safety Code 2016.
