## INFORMATION SHEET ON NEW AND EXISTING SLIPWAYS AND BOATSHEDS

#### Existing Slipways and/or Boatsheds

A lawfully established slipway and or/ associated boatshed is a permitted activity. For information on whether the reconstruction, alteration or extension of the boatshed and associated ramps or rails is permitted, please see page 112 sc. (j) of the Regional Coastal Environment Plan (RCEP):

#### New Slipways and/or Boatsheds

Resource consent will be required from Environment Canterbury for constructing any new structure in the Coastal Marine Area. Check with Christchurch City Council or Local District Council to see if consent is required from them too.

### Resource Consent application information

To erect and/or place a new structure (in other words boatshed or slipway) on, under or over the foreshore or seabed requires resource consent under Part 3 – 20 Section 12 of the Resource Management Act 1991, unless expressly allowed by a rule in the Regional Coastal Environment Plan (RCEP) or resource consent. <a href="http://www.legislation.govt.nz/act/public/1991/0069/latest/whole.html#DLM230265MA">http://www.legislation.govt.nz/act/public/1991/0069/latest/whole.html#DLM230265MA</a>

- To erect and/or place a new boatshed/slipway or rails outside a Boatshed Area; and within an Area of Significant Natural Value or areas listed in Schedule 5.13; is a non-complying activity (see page 115 Rule 8.4 of RCEP)
- To erect a new boatshed/slipway on, under, or over any foreshore or seabed is a Discretionary Activity (see page 114 Rule 8.2)
