RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ACT 1991 NOTICE OF DECISION: RESOURCE CONSENT NO. CRC052103 & CRC054650

The decision of Environment Canterbury is to grant your application on the terms and conditions specified in the attached resource consent document. The reasons for the decision are

IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY:

LOCATION:

Rakaia Island RAKAIA RIVER

SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- The works shall be restricted to the disturbance of the bed and margins of the Rakaia River, removal and placement of material, placement and modification of structures, and removal and planting of plants.
- The works shall only be undertaken between an upstream point being at or about map reference NZMS 260 L36:3807-1327 and a downstream point being at or about map reference NZMS 260 L37:4760-0115.
- 3) The works shall be carried out in accordance with the layout shown on Plan CRC052103 attached to this consent, and shall not be undertaken beyond the outermost line marked on the Plan.
- 4) Prior to commencing the works, all persons undertaking activities authorised by this consent shall be made familiar with the conditions of this consent.
- The consent holder shall meet with Canterbury Regional Council River Engineering Staff in April/May each year prior to any river protection works being carried out during the following winter months to identify the areas requiring erosion protection works and to determine and agree on the scale and location of the works required. Within five working days of completion of works the consent holder shall notify the Canterbury Regional Council Compliance Monitoring Section.
- 6) The Canterbury Regional Council shall be notified not less than 48 hours prior to the commencement of works.
- 7) If further work at the site is not to occur within seven days following the last working at the site, then the following shall occur:
 - all stockpiles and other deposits of gravel, sand, and other natural material, including reject material, shall be levelled to the natural bed level, and
 - as far as practicable, the work area shall be reshaped and formed to a state consistent with the surrounding natural riverbed.
- 8) Apart from structures constructed under this consent, work sites shall as far as practicable be left in a state consistent with the surrounding natural river bed.
- Works carried out within 200 metres of the Rakaia Island Bridge shall ensure that this section is maintained as an overflow area for high flows.
- 10) As far as practicable, no works shall be carried out in flowing water
- 11) The works shall not prevent the passage of fish to a flowing braid of the Rakaia River or cause the stranding of fish in pools or channels

- 12) There shall be no agricultural encroachment beyond the innermost line marked on Plan CRC052103
- Prior to commencement of works the consent holder shall supply Canterbury Regional Council with a copy of Plan CRC052103, clearly showing the location of the existing boundary fence and the location of the proposed works (as marked on Plan CRC 052103), together with a grid and at a scale that allows determination of a grid reference to an accuracy of within 10 metres.
- 14) All practicable measures shall be undertaken to minimise vehicles and machinery entering river channels containing flowing water.
- 15) Apart from emergency works, works shall not occur during the period of 1st October to 30th April in any year
- 16) All disturbed areas shall be stabilised as soon as practicable following completion of the works.
- 17) Machinery shall be free of plants and plant seeds prior to use in the riverbed.
- 18) Earthworks shall not be undertaken in a manner likely to cause erosion of, or instability to, the banks or bed of the Rakaia River.
- All practicable measures shall be undertaken to minimise adverse effects on property, amenity values, wildlife, vegetation, particularly indigenous vegetation, and ecological values
- 20) There shall be no storage of fuel or machinery or refuelling of vehicles and machinery anywhere in the bed of the waterway.
- 21) All spoil and other waste material from the works shall be removed from site on completion of works.
- Works shall be carried out in a manner which ensures that there is no reduction in the flood carrying capacity of the Rakaia River and that there is no flooding of adjacent properties
- 23) No works shall occur within 100 metres of sites where birds are breeding or nesting on the riverbed.
- 24) The works shall not restrict public access to, or along, the riverbed.
- 25) In the event of any disturbance of Koiwi Tangata or taonga the consent holder shall:
 - Cease any further excavation for a period of at least 24 hrs.
 - Immediately advise the Canterbury Regional Council of the disturbance and, immediately advise Te Tuamutu Runanga of the disturbance.
- The Canterbury Regional Council may, once per year, on any of the last five working days of May or November, serve notice of its intention to review the conditions of this consent for the purposes of dealing with any adverse effect on the environment which may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage.
- 27) The lapsing date for the purposes of section 125 shall be 30 Septmber 2010

- 3) No diversions shall be carried out within 100 meters of the Rakaia Island Bridge
- 4) All practicable measures shall be undertaken to minimise adverse effects on property, amenity values, wildlife, vegetation, particularly indigenous vegetation, and ecological values
- 5) Diversions shall be carried out in a manner which ensures that there is no reduction in the flood carrying capacity of the Rakaia River and that there is no flooding of adjacent properties
- 6) The works shall not prevent the passage of fish, or cause the stranding of fish in pools or channels.
- 7) The Canterbury Regional Council may, once per year, on any of the last five working days of May or November, serve notice of its intention to review the conditions of this consent for the purposes of dealing with any adverse effect on the environment which may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage.
- 8) The lapsing date for the purposes of section 125 shall be 30th September 2010
