To grant a speed uplifting to allow training operations using power-driven vessels for which the safe and effective operation requires them to exceed speed limits mandated by Maritime Rules Part 91 or the Bylaw.

#### Reservation:

When undertaking training for rescue operations, power-driven vessels (including personal water craft (jet skis) and IRBs) owned and/or operated by Surf Life Saving New Zealand or their affiliated clubs are exempt from:

- the Maritime Rules Part 91.6(1)(a) 5 knot speed limit within 50 metres of any other vessel, raft, or person in the water; and
- the Maritime Rules Part 91.6(1)(b) 5 knot speed limit with 200 metres of the shore; and
- in the case of Sumner Bay, the Bylaws Controls Map 8 5 knot speed limit within 400 metres from the shore.

For the sake of clarification, when undertaking actual rescue operations, the vessels above are deemed by Maritime Rules Part 91 to be emergency response craft and are granted by that Part an exemption from the above-noted speed restrictions.

## Publication of notice of Reservation:

- Notification to known affected groups.
- Signs clearly indicating the area and intended use of the beach at times of training.
- Minimum sign size of 600mm x 800mm.

### Safety conditions:

- 1. Every vessel operating under this Temporary Reservation shall do so in compliance with the Safe Operating Plans of Surf Lifesaving New Zealand.
- 2. Personal Flotation Devices (life-jackets) of an appropriate fit and type are to be worn on all powered craft.
- 3. All persons undergoing training shall be briefed fully on Surf Life Saving New Zealand's Safe Operating Plan and the conditions of this reservation.
- 4. The Reserved Area notified in this Temporary Reservation Certificate has been uplifted and reserved for the sole purpose of training workers from Surf Life Saving New Zealand or its affiliated clubs. Should any other swimmer or vessel be in the area, all vessels are immediately to comply with Maritime Rules 91 and 22. http://www.maritimenz.govt.nz/rules/part-22/http://www.maritimenz.govt.nz/rules/part-91/
- 5. Prior to the event the training area is to be checked for any hazards natural or otherwise that may impede safety, and all persons undergoing training are to be made aware of these hazards.
- 6. A lookout is to be on the beach with sufficient visibility to monitor vessels undergoing training and is to warn trainees of any swimmers, surfers, or other water users who enter in the area so they can comply with condition 3.

Temporary Reservation shall not take effect if: Conditions above are not met.
