Purpose:

1/ Speed uplifting within areas restricted to 5 knots within 200 metres of the shore for Wakeboard competitors and safety boats only, on Lake Ruataniwha.

2/ Reservation of the Lake Ruataniwha for wakeboarding competition to allow high speed wakeboard competiton without other vessels or swimmers impeding vessel and wakeboards competing.

Reservation:

No vessel shall navigate within the Reserved Area as listed above **except with the express permission of, and in** a manner explicitly approved by, the certificate holder or his delegate. Or the Harbourmaster.

Conditions:

Publication of notice of Reservation:

Notification to known affected groups; notifications on appropriate websites and social media, public notification in local and South Island newspapers, notices at known boat ramps and key access points, within 7 days of the event.

Notice of Reservation to be:

Displayed at: As above. Displayed by: Keri Ring (or delegate) Removed by: Keri Ring (or delegate)

A copy of the Temporary Reservation Certificate to be carried by: Keri Ring

Safety conditions:

- 1. Wake NZ Health and Safety Plan to be complied with.
- 2. Should any unauthorised vessel or swimmer enter the reserved area, the drivers of the wake boats are to slow immediately to less than 5 knots to avoid a collision and cease wakeboarding until such time as the course is declared clear by Keri Ring or a nominated safety officer.
- 3. A log is to be kept of any incident involving other vessels and swimmers and provided to the Harbourmaster within 5 days of the event.
- 4. Should any collisions occur, the Harbourmaster is to be contacted on 3289168 immediately and all competitors are required to stop competing until clearance is given by the Harbourmaster or Harbourmaster duty officer.

Temporary Reservation shall not take effect if: Conditions above are not met.
