Purpose:

To allow Canterbury Jet sports Club to host and run a social ride from Lyttelton to Kaiapoi and return.

Exemption:

Vessels may exceed the 5-knot limit within 50 metres of other vessels participating in the event whilst traveling as a group along the designated route.

Conditions:

All participants are to be fully briefed on safety procedures including safety plans as provided prior to going on the water.

- 1. Participants are to be advised that if other outside vessels enter the group the normal rules of navigation apply, as directed by Rule 22 and 91 of the Maritime Rules.
- 2. All participants are to wear personal flotation devices that comply with New Zealand Standard (NZS) 5823: 1999, NZ S5823: 2001, or NZS 5823: 2005 specification for buoyancy aids and marine safety harnesses and lines or another national standard substantially complying with the New Zealand standards. These include US, Australian, European and ISO standards.
- 3. The 5-knot speed limit from the Waimakariri Bar to Kaiapoi is to be observed by all participants.
- 4. The group is to be traveling is relatively the same direction and at the same speed as much as practically possible.
