As per submitted safety plan, including, but not limited to:

- 1. Two safety vessels stationed on the eastern and western ends of the reserved area. These vessels are to allow and coordinate non-event related traffic through the reserved area in between stages of the event. Vessels must be in contact with one another via VHF radio and/or cell phones.
- 2. PFDs must be worn by all staff and competitors at all times in accordance with Part 91 of the Maritime Transport Act and the Canterbury Regional Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016.
- 3. There must be a warden stationed at Naval Point Public Ramp to inform any boats launching of the event. This person must be in contact with the safety vessels via VHF or cell phone.
- 4. The safety vessels must be clearly marked with a bright coloured flag flown at least one metre about the deck. This is simply to draw attention to the area as it is the main throughfare for vessels departing or arriving from the main ramp.
- 5. A printed map of the reserved area must be posted on both sides of Naval Point Public Ramp on the day of the event.
